



3.4 God Saves, Part 2

The following passages have been provided for you to model to the children in your small group how to look for truth in Scripture. Some verses may be engaging for your children while others may simply aid in your preparation to lead this time of discussion.

Questions:

- Read Esther 2:20. Who told Esther to keep her Jewish family history a secret? (Her cousin, Mordecai.)
- 2. Read Esther 3:1–2. What did the king command people to do when they saw Haman? (He commanded them to bow down and give honor to Haman.) Who didn't bow to Haman? (Mordecai.)
- 3. Read verses 5–6. What did Haman do when he saw that Mordecai refused to bow down to him? (He got angry and looked for a way to get rid of Mordecai and all the Jews.)
- Read Esther 4:12-14. Why did Mordecai think God put Esther in the palace? (To help save her people.)
- 5. Read Esther 7:3. What did Esther ask the king? (She asked him to save her and her people, the Jews.)
- 6. Read Esther 8:8. What did the king do to help save the Jews? (He made a new law that would help them.)
- 7. What part do you think you can play in The Big God Story?
